

Massachusetts Education Policy Fellowship Program, 2018–2019

Massachusetts EPFP is a ten-month professional development program for individuals who seek to enhance their knowledge and develop their skills in education leadership and public policy. The program in Massachusetts is one of seventeen sites of the national EPFP program sponsored by the [Institute for Educational Leadership](#) in Washington, D.C. The program has been preparing leaders and policymakers in education and human services since 1964.

Massachusetts EPFP is an opportunity to:

- Develop leadership skills and learn about your leadership potential;
- Engage in education policy discussions with experts in the field; and
- Create a network with local, state, and national fellows and alumni.

Program Details

The program year begins with an overnight retreat in Ashland, Massachusetts. Fellows meet monthly in Boston on Tuesdays from September through June. Meetings include guest speakers and discussion among Fellows on topics related to leadership and education policy. Fellows also participate in a two-day tour focused on Massachusetts civil rights history, a full-day session at the State House, and a four-day conference in Washington, D.C. that brings together Fellows from around the country.
