


New Englanders Believe Student-Centered Learning Is Key To College and Career Readiness

90% of New Englanders felt that it was important for students to participate in a student-centered learning environment in order to be college and career ready.






New Englanders Know Students Aren't Graduating College And Career Ready

Only half of our students are prepared for life after high school. More than 50% of New Englanders were able to correctly identify this fact. Overall, nearly 70% believe we are seriously falling short in terms of ensuring students' college and career readiness.

New Englanders Are Developing A Deeper Understanding About Student-Centered Learning

Four years ago, only 30% of New Englanders who had heard the term student-centered learning had a partial or full understanding of the definition. Now, 88% of New Englanders who have heard the term student-centered learning can correctly identify at least 4 of 8 elements of the definition.
