## **MA Education Reform Act (1993)**

#### Equity

-Increased state funding -Created minimum foundation

#### **Standards**

-New Curriculum frameworks -MCAS and graduation standards -Revision of teacher licensure

#### **Accountability**

 Evaluation of school and district performance (EQA)
Increased state authority

#### <u>Choice</u>

-Expanded inter-district choice -Authorized charter schools

## **Student-Centered Learning**

- Individualization: Students engage in authentic, self-paced learning activities driven by their interests and abilities.
- Student agency: Students are active participants in setting goals and determining how learning happens.
- Relationships: Learning takes place in the context of strong adultstudent and peer-to-peer relationships.
- Expanding learning opportunities: Learning takes place in a variety of settings and beyond school hours.



## **Early Education Indicators**





## Children aged 0-5 eligible for a subsidy and enrolled in high-quality early education programs





### **K-12 Indicators**







Students **absent from school** 10% or more of days enrolled Students passing all 9th grade courses





## **College and Career Indicators**






Students graduating from high school in 4 years
