EDUCATION AND BUSINESS LEADERS TO DISCUSS WORKFORCE READINESS IN WESTERN MA

Education Secretary James Peyser, State Senator Eric Lesser, and the education and business communities to gather in Holyoke on May 10

The <u>Rennie Center for Education Research & Policy</u> invites journalists to a discussion on the status of education in Western Massachusetts and its impact on workforce readiness.

According to the Rennie Center's <u>Condition of Education in the Commonwealth Report</u>, <u>30</u> <u>percent</u> of Massachusetts public school graduates require developmental—or remedial—courses when enrolling the state's public colleges and universities. Meanwhile, a survey by the Massachusetts Business Alliance for Education finds that <u>75 percent</u> of employers have trouble finding qualified job applicants.

The event will look at this disconnect between the lessons taught in schools and the skills needed for success in college and in the workforce. Experts will discuss ways in which student-centered learning, an approach that tailors education to the interests and learning style of each student, can prepare students for the 21st century job market.

The event puts a local focus on the <u>Condition of Education in the Commonwealth Report</u>, which looks at student progress in Massachusetts while pointing to areas in need of continued improvement.
