# Massachusetts Education Policy Fellowship Program, 2021–2022

Massachusetts EPFP is a ten-month professional development program for individuals who seek to enhance their knowledge and develop their skills in education leadership and public policy. The program in Massachusetts is one of several sites of the national EPFP program sponsored by the Institute for Educational Leadership in Washington, D.C. The program has been preparing leaders and policymakers in education and human services since 1964.

Massachusetts EPFP is an opportunity to:

- Develop leadership skills and learn about your leadership potential;
- Broaden your understanding of the policy process and education equity issues through conversations with fellows and experts; and
- Create a network with local, state, and national fellows and alumni.

## **Program Details**

The program year begins with a retreat in Ashland, Massachusetts. Fellows meet monthly on Tuesdays from September through June. Meetings include guest speakers and discussion among Fellows on topics related to leadership and education policy. Fellows also participate in a two-day tour focused on Massachusetts civil rights history, a full-day State House session, and a four-day conference in Washington, D.C. that brings together Fellows from around the country.

Applications will be accepted on a rolling basis until June 11, 2021. Interested applicants are encouraged to submit applications as early as possible.
